



### **STABILITY AND REFORMS BEFORE THE FISCAL CRISIS (from July 2 to 4)**

After witnessing for the last three years a very serious financial and economic crisis with important social consequences, the unsustainability of public accounts now threatens to generate a fiscal crisis and of public debt which, if not corrected in a credible manner, could end up acting as a feedback of new financial stresses which could hamper the recovery of Western economy and of its employment levels.

This crisis is particularly serious for Spain as it combines an irresponsible fiscal behaviour during the years of international prosperity –making us especially financially vulnerable– with a fiscal response before the crisis that was wasteful, inadequately orientated and ineffective. It is thus particularly important to analyse the set of structural and fiscal policy reforms capable of generating a high potential growth which would nourish the creation of employment and the restoration of broad fiscal bases. It is therefore essential to generate a credible and lasting commitment during the cuts in public spending and the increase of efficiency in the rendering of public services in Spain.

### **FREEDOM IN 2010: QUANDARIES AND OPPORTUNITIES (from July 5 to 8)**

The crisis has forced a redefinition not only of the global economic setting, but also of the political one. The international course will analyse the consequences resulting from the new scenario for freedom across the world. The emergence of new global players, nuclear proliferation, the outlook of the UK after the elections, or the deterioration of the Spanish international image due to Socialist policies, are some of the issues that will be addressed. Furthermore, as every year, the reforms considered to be necessary for Latin America will be studied as well as the threat posed by populism, at a time that coincides with the celebration of the Bicentenaries of the Declarations of Independence.

### **AN AGENDA FOR REFORM (from July 9 to 11)**

A serious economic crisis and an equally serious institutional crisis converge in the current Spanish setting limiting the capacity of our political and administrative system of generating solutions and affecting the credibility of our country. What should be done and how, must be defined. Only then will it be possible to begin initiatives and open them to those wishing to join them.

To this effect, this course will try to analyse some fields of our constitutional and institutional reality, such as the model of territorial organization and of supranational integration or the better running of institutions and constitutional bodies. These aspects are, no doubt, essential for the future of our country and for the free societies of our time, regarding which specific proposals for reform can be articulated, in accordance with a Foundation addressed, from its very name, to the Analyses and Social Studies.
