Short summary:

National pilot project on the design and model of effective and democratically controlled self-administration in the 2 biggest provincial capitals of Cambodia.

Outputs:

- New local administrative competences;
- One-Window-Service Offices,
- Urban District Councils,
- Local Ombudsman,
- Participatory Planning Mechanisms

Area:

Cambodia: One of the Poorest Countries in Asia. Destroyed by war, the Khmer Rouge Genocide and 15 years of Civil War - Heavily Centralised State Structures.
